Our Objectives

- Have dedicated student housing for 800 students by 2035
- Rehab 40 existing properties;
- Increase new housing by 252 single units and 84 multi-family by 2030
- Increase safe, affordable rentals by ____% by 2030
- Have 20 transitional units and 20 supportive units by 2030

Our Teams

- 1. **Chair/Knowledge Holder**: Leads the initiative, understands it fully, and can present it to the community.
- 2. **Communications:** Keeps records and updates others on progress and engagement.
- 3. **Data Coordinator:** Tracks housing needs against results to measure community impact.
- 4. **Education Influencer:** Builds support by raising awareness and advocating for investment.
- 5. **Finance & Incentive:** Identifies funding and resources to support the initiative.
- 6. **Governmental Representative:** Elected officials who promote the vision and report back to their entity and community.
- 7. **Housing Units:** Defines the number and type of homes needed to support community growth.
- 8. **Regulatory/Zoning:** Guides land use and zoning policies needed for housing growth.
- 9. **Developer:** Construction expert who advocates for and supports housing development.
